

# **New Zealand Cycle Network Existing and Potential Rides** 2018 - 2023 Great Ride - existing eartland Ride - existing Heartland Ride - potential Other cyleways - existing Public Transport Links Great Rides are premier rides, predominantly off road, showcasing the best of New Zealand. Heartland Rides are predominantly on quiet Public Transport Links are either essential connections (i.e., ferries) or highly recommended to avoid busy roads (i.e., trains) This map provides a snapshot of what a connected New Zealand cycling network could look like in the future. It is not definitive and A national cycling network is just one part of a long-term strategic view to provide a range of improved transport options for journeys throughout New Zealand. A particular goal is to connect Great Rides to urban centres, and other Great Rides, using predominantly onroad infrastructure (i.e., Heartland Rides). The existing routes shown have been approved and meet NZCT Design Guide criteria. The potential routes shown have been captured from key stakeholders including the Transport Agency, MBIE, DOC, NZCT Inc,














Maslow's hierarchy of cycle trail needs
